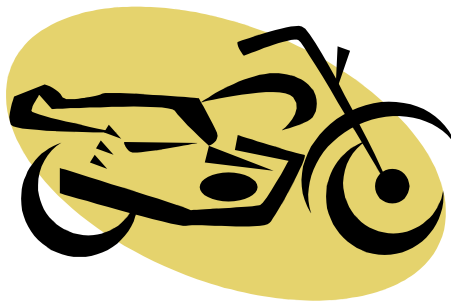
tourney will be in the morning of August 18 & 19. Applications are available in the pro shop or on our website:

SCCC Green Speed

A healthy, vigorous green can be maintained at a very short cutting height (as low as 1/8—inch) for short periods of time without consequences if it has been prepared properly and weather conditions are acceptable. Courses hosting big tournaments often take months (and spend significant extra money) to bring greens up to an ultrafast speed for PGA Tour players.

However, fast greens become extremely fragile. If you compared them with human beings, it would be fair to say that their immune systems can become very weak. They become susceptible to disease, pests and heat stress. Weather is probably the biggest threat to ultrafast greens. High temperatures and lack of moisture in the air are deadly to greens that are maintained at very short cutting heights for any length of time.

SCCC greens are very healthy even during our hot summer months. To protect our greens, it is not feasible to put them in the ultra fast speed category. Plus, no one would be able to finish in less than four hours.
