Do You Know...Hazard Options?

Do you know the difference between a red hazard and a yellow hazard?

Yellow Hazards typically run across or perpendicular to a hole and red hazards typically run parallel to a hole.

You have a few extra options if your ball is within a red lined or lateral water hazard.

When your ball is in any water hazard (red or yellow) these are your options..

- 1) Hit the ball where it lies (be careful not to ground your club or take practice swings) No penalty taken!!
- 2) Keep the point where it last crossed the hazard line between you and the flagstick and go back as far as

you want. This costs you one penalty stroke.

- 3) ReHit from the previous spot you hit from. This costs one penalty stroke.

When your ball is in a red hazard, you have 2 additional options.

- 1) You can drop you ball up to two club lengths to the side (no closer to the hole)

from the point where your ball crossed the hazard.

This cost one penalty stroke.

And Finally ..amaze your playing partners that you know this option... You can drop the ball on the opposite margin of the hazard equal distance from the hole. This also costs one penalty stroke.
